

EVAC Chair Train the Trainer

Description:

The course details both the Evac Chair and the training techniques and lesson planning required to deliver a course. This course provides the necessary information and training to teach individuals to assist anyone who may benefit from the use of an Evac Chair, enabling the organisation to comply with the Disability Discrimination Act 2005 and the Equality Act 2010.

Objectives:

On completion of the course delegates will be able to:

- Understand different learning styles
- Work in a team to complete a practical task
- Get the most out of communication techniques
- Get the most out of different learning resources
- Write an effective lesson plan
- Be able to manage a practical activity
- Be competent to train an evac chair in house
- Compliance: Under the Disabled Discrimination Act 2005 and the Equality Act 2010, it is unlawful to discriminate against a person on the grounds of disability. This includes evacuating premises in the event of a fire. Being left in a building while other colleagues evacuate is not only unsafe, it is a clear breach of the law. Proper procedures must be in place in the event of an incident. These procedures must be learnt and practised by anyone responsible for evacuating a building using evacuation equipment.

Prerequisites:

Must be competent in the use of Evac chairs & Understand the training syllabus.

Typical Interest Groups:

Anyone who works with or is involved in the use of an evac chair.

Suitability:

This course is suitable for all operators, supervisors and managers who work with an evac chair as part of their job.

Qualification:

On completion of the course, delegates will receive a certificate of competence.

Course Size:

The minimum number of delegates per session is 3.
