

Fire Awareness

Description:

This course has been developed in accordance with the Health & Safety at Work Act 1974, the Fire Precautions (Workplace) Regulations 1997 and the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005. This course aims to reduce the risk of fire by providing basic fire safety training to staff and promoting fire safety awareness.

Objectives:

By the end of the programme the delegate will have an understanding of:

- Fire safety regulations/legislation
- Basic fire prevention
- Fire procedures
- Evacuation procedures
- The chemistry of fire and how it spreads
- · Common causes of fire Safety features within the building
- Fire detection procedures
- Calling the fire service
- Hazard identification/reduction
- Fire notices
- Record keeping
- Daily and weekly fire checks
- Fire Extinguishers
- Fire action planning
- Evacuation of people with special needs Liaison with fire brigade/fire service
- Dealing with bomb threats
