

Fire Warden / Fire Marshal

Description:

This is a course specifically designed for those who have been or will be appointed to carry out the duties of a Fire Warden or Fire Marshall. The course covers the theory of combustion, the causes of fire and the correct way to fight a fire using the fire extinguishers available. The Fire Warden/Marshall course lasts approximately 3 hours.

Objectives:

On completion of the course, delegates will be able to identify and respond to:

- · Fire safety regulations/legislation
- · Basic fire prevention
- Fire legislation
- The basic chemistry of fire and its different classes
- Fire fighting procedures
- Causes of fire and fire prevention
- Fixed firefighting equipment
- Evacuation assembly points and fire drills
- Fire alarms
- Fire hazards
- Human behaviour in a fire
- Risk assessment awareness
- Roles and responsibilities of a fire marshal/fire safety officer
- Fire extinguisher recognition and use (theory)

Qualification:

On successful completion, candidates will receive a certificate which is valid for one year. This qualification provides sufficient evidence to satisfy the training requirements of the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005.

All employers and employees in all work environments.

Suitability:

Designed for all levels of staff to develop their awareness of fire, and how to manage an incident

Course Size:

The maximum number of delegates per session is 12.

Prerequisites:

None. This course provides a good level of knowledge and skills to enable even a complete beginner to be confident in dealing with hazardous situations.
