LIVE FIRE

DESCRIPTION

This course has been designed in accordance with the 1971 *Fire Precautions Act*, 1974 *Health & Safety at Work Act*, the *Fire Precautions (Workplace) Regulations 1997* and the *Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005*. This course aims to reduce the risk of fire by providing basic fire training for staff and promoting fire safety awareness. The course also offers a practical element where you put out a live fire with extinguishers.
